2. I said I 'd die if it was true! **(die) (be)**
3. If she didn't do that, she couldn't do anything. **(not/do) (not/do)**
4. I wouldn't marry you if you were an emperor. **(not/marry) (be)**
5. If I declined the task, it would lie upon quite another principle. **(decline) (lie)**
6. If he stayed he was afraid that he would play the fool. **(stay) (play)**
7. But, dear friends, if I did not change the stop sometimes, the machine would wear out in one part and rust in another. **(not/change) (wear out)**
8. He wrote me a letter saying that he would give her back to me if I gave you up. **(give) (give)**

10. If I had time I 'd rescue her. **(have) (rescue)**

(fail) (passive/abandon)

(hear) (be)

17. Wouldn't it be funny if he were dead? **(it/not/be/?)** **(be)**

(tell) (not/like)
